

- Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper – When diluted nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners.
- Fire Extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates and plastic utensils, paper towels
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

What will you do if you have to leave your home in an emergency?

Take the time now to fill a backpack or duffel bag with items you will need if you are away from home. Remember to take credit cards, cash, prescription medications, extra keys to your house and vehicles and important documents, such as health insurance and identification cards. You should also pack:

- Water
- Non-perishable packaged or canned food and a can opener
- Portable, battery-powered radio or television and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit and manual
- Whistle
- Local map
- Family Emergency Plan card
- Photos of family members and pets for re-identification purposes
- Items for infants or elderly family members.
- Over the counter medications
- Personal hygiene items
- Change of clothes
- Pet food, medications and hygiene items
- Prepaid phone card
