

# ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF RESIDENCY

What constitutes residency?

A resident is a person who lives in the Town of Greenburgh Unincorporated Area. A person's residency is a dwelling, abode or habitation for a continuance of time. NOTE: Owning property in Greenburgh does not necessarily qualify a person as a resident.

## ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF RESIDENCY:

1. A driver's license **AND** any one of the following items that must indicate a current date:
  - a. Car Registration
  - b. Household bill (i.e. ConEd, Water, Cable, Home Telephone/Internet)
  - c. A recent oil receipt
  - d. Social Security check with address
  - e. Retirement check with address
  - f. Social Service voucher with address
2. A photo ID is required if you don't have a driver's license, along with TWO of the above suggested proofs of residency. (See a-f).
3. New Resident – when a town resident has just moved into town, they need to present the following:
  - a. Photo ID/Driver's License AND
  - b. TWO of the following
    - ◆ Notice to turn on ConEd
    - ◆ Notice to install home phone/internet/cable
    - ◆ Notice from bank to transfer account address

**PLEASE NOTE:** The Town of Greenburgh reserves the right to request additional verification and to reject any proof it deems questionable. Student ID or birth certificates may be requested for Youth Unicards included in family memberships. Unicards are required for everyone two years of age and over. The staff reserves the right to ask patrons to produce their uncard upon request. Residents are encouraged to make illegal uncard holders known to the Recreation Department. No names will be revealed. We cannot guarantee that only residents are using town facilities without your help.
